Faculty Senate Committee Report for the Assessment of Instruction Committee for the 2022 – 2023 Academic Year

The mission of the Assessment of Instruction Committee (AIC) is to advise the Provost and Faculty Senate on matters related to the evaluation of teaching at the University. The AIC is composed of faculty, administrators, and students. Committee members are selected by the provost and by the Faculty Senate.

B. Structural Changes

The AIC created two subcommittees for the 2022 - 2023 academic year. One committee discussed the creation of a revised reporting form for SFF feedback to instructors; the other committee discussed the creation of a toolkit for alternative ways to assess teaching. Both of these are discussed below.

C. Number and Frequency of Meetings

The AIC met monthly from October to April.

D. Issues Discussed by the Committee and Decisions or Actions Implemented

There were four major issues discussed by the Committee:

- Consistent with previous years, the Committee discussed proposed additions
 by instructors for inclusion in the SFF item bank. When the new SFF system
 was implemented, it was designed so that instructors could propose new
 questions. One of the AIC's responsibilities is to approve or modify these
 new questions.
- The AIC had created a document during the 2021 2022 academic year that discussed the appropriate use of student feedback data. This document was finalized and is available on the Center for the Advancement of Teaching (CAT) website–<u>Recommendations for the Use of Student Feedback Data at Temple</u>.
- When the new SFF system was implemented it was agreed that the final aspect of this revision was to improve the format by which the data are reported to instructors. This was the major issue discussed by the Committee during the year. Discussions were held with a wide variety of stakeholders about what was needed if the current form was replaced. A new format was created and was approved by the Committee. This revised reporting form has been submitted to the office of Instructional Technology to ascertain how these proposed changes can be implemented in terms of time and cost.
- The Committee recognizes that the TAUP contract specifies that student feedback data must not be the primary way that teaching is evaluated. To assist with this, the AIC has begun to create what we are calling a toolkit for

alternative ways to assess teaching. A draft of this document was created and will be finalized during the fall 2023 semester.
