The meeting was called to order at 1:00 pm

- Dr. Kimmika Williams-Witherspoon welcomed attendees
- RFS notified of plans to publish attendance records so all faculty are aware who their reps are so that shared faculty governance participant can be recognized
- Executive Committee introduced. Dr. Shohreh Amini introduced herself as VP of Faculty Senate. Dr. Quaiser Abdullah absent.

- Gave update on status of committees. Identified committees that are filled.

 - Introduced herself and work on task force. Highlighted presence of new VP of Public Safety
 - Patrol Area: 18th to 9th and Susquehanna to Jefferson; Broad and 13th to Girard. On the portal and website (Campus Safety)
 - Updates on campus safety initiatives (grant program to community partners to enhance safety – successful; more cameras deployed; FLIGHT Program; Walking Escort; Crime Reduction Grants; Parents Roundtable Continued)
 - Questions
 - Walking Escort at TUCC?
 - Leadership change at TUCC. Will be evaluated.
 - How is the relationship between students and community and safety officers?
 - Room for improvement. Things have been improved because of engagement in the community.
 - Were safety updates added to TUportal due to feedback?
 - Yes, series of conversations showed that community wanted more information.
 - Can frequency of campus shuttles be increased?
 - Usage was minimal. Will bring up with Campus Operations
 - Can you share about the Alerts?
 - Notify community that something has happened so that people can "change their behavior" with respect to the area under consideration.
 Crime log posted on the website daily, including disposition of the crime.
 - What can faculty do to be part of the solution?
 - Call Campus Safety if anything comes up. We prefer to be there if something comes up instead of not being present and something is happening.

- Parents who coordinated private patrols were not an official project of the Family Council
- Guardian App (Rave Guardian) available for use Tool for real-time interaction with the safety center
- Scott Sauer, COO, SEPTA
 - Discussed SEPTA's service and partnership with university
 - Highlighted safety protocols considering COVID Ridership increasing September 2022
 - Highlighted new crime prevention strategies (increased pay, recruitment, reassignment to platforms)
 - o SEPTA Transit Watch app available; 30,000 cameras in system; call boxes on platforms
 - Hired 50 social workers to support vulnerable populations who interact with the subway systems
 - Virtual patrol Active monitoring of cameras
 - SCOPE Program integrates services for residents experiencing housing insecurity;
 increased cleaning frequently
 - Service times shifted; no fare increases
 - Question and discussion on how Temple can participate in SEPTA's Key Advantage program
