Dr. Jamie Reilly is a professor at Temple University where he directs the Concepts & Cognition Laboratory (www.reilly-coglab.com). Dr. Reilly's early training included degrees in anthropological linguistics (BA, Tulane University) and speech-language-hearing science (MA, Temple University). He completed a PhD in cognitive psychology (Temple University) and an NIH-T32 postdoctoral fellowship in cognitive neuroscience (University of Pennsylvania), both focused on language processing. Jamie is a translational researcher with expertise in neurolinguistics and clinical management of progressive language and memory disorders (e.g. Alzheimer's Disease). His recent work has included the development of open-source language software, synchrony between speakers during intergenerational conversations, and empirical studies of the nature of uncontrolled cursing in acquired brain injuries. He studies language phenomena using a multi-method approach involving a combination of behavior, eyetracking, neurostimulation, and neuroimaging. Jamie is dedicated to interdisciplinary research and involving students at all levels in the research process.
