1. Presentation on Climate in Curricula: Teaching for the Future of Work and the World

Presenters: Mohammad Kiani, Mechanical Engineering, Marissa Cloutier, Social and Behavioral Sciences, Rob Kuper, Landscape Architecture

Overview

- **Climate Change:** Discussion of climate change since 2012, highlighting the urgency to act within the next 10-15 years.
- **Policy Needs:** Rational policies on energy, agriculture, and deforestation.

Current Situation

- **College Applicants:** 59% consider green commitment in their application decisions.
- **Temple University:** Decrease in sustainability courses over the past five years. Majority of students graduate without basic climate change knowledge. Climate change is not mentioned in Temple's strategic mission.
- **Student Feedback:** Surveys indicate students feel they lack sustainability and climate change content in their courses. Peer institutions have more sustainability programs.

Recommendations

1. Faculty Training: Using models like the Piedmont/Ponderosa Project

- 2. GenEd Component: Implement a general education requirement.
- 3. Interdisciplinary Programs: Create or bolster degree-granting programs and certificates.

Faculty Training Model: Piedmont Project

- Components:
 - 1. Duration, timing, incentive
 - 2. Attendee preparation, initial and return commitment
 - 3. Structure participant attendees
 - 4. Goals, objectives, and measures for success

• Best Practices:

- 1. Awareness of best practices
- 2. Number of instructors
- 3. Knowledge of instruction
- 4. Prepare students
